Vestiges of Green

An audio walk dedicated to the first Botanical Garden of Berlin with Caroline Böttcher and Julia Ohlendorf

Why did a 100-year-old palm from the Garden of Science cause an uproar in the 18th century? What piece of colonial history do many Germans keep on their windowsills? Why are cities rich in species?

"Vestiges of Green" is dedicated to this and many other questions as it accompanies listeners through what is today known as Heinrich von Kleist Park in Schöneberg. Established in 1679, this is where the first Botanical Garden of Berlin had its home for more than 240 years and where plants were cultivated for seeds to export to Germany's colonies.

Today, hardly anything of this special facility and its history remains. Apart from the "Haus am Kleistpark" itself, inaugurated in 1880 as the Royal Botanical Museum (and once housing the herbarium of Adelbert von Chamisso), all the buildings of the Botanical Garden have disappeared.

Following the park plan of 1886, the audio walk consists of eleven stops along the former locations of the once impressive greenhouses. The audio-play scenes are dedicated to botanical passion and its economic, political, and historical entanglements. Experts such as Dr Katja Kaiser (historian of colonial botany) and Dr Nils Köster (curator of the living collection of the Dahlem Botanical Garden) share anecdotes and knowledge while engaging in imaginary conversations with voices from the past, such as Rosa Luxemburg, Jean-Jacques Rousseau, and Franklin D. Roosevelt.

The free audio walk will become available from 30.4.2022 and thereafter be accessible at any time via the "Guidemate" app. A map of the area with the various stops will appear on people's mobile-phone displays. GPS data locate the listeners' positions, and the audio tracks are then automatically started at the respective stations. The audio walk was designed to be listened to on headphones. Kleistpark is barrier-free.
